

Occupational schemes

Introduction

Occupational pension schemes are provided by businesses and other organisations for the benefit of staff. They may also be described as Superannuation Funds. Records of such schemes might include: the minutes of trustees or management committees governing the scheme; trust deeds and rules establishing how the pension scheme will be run and how benefits are calculated and payable; the correspondence of secretaries or pension managers involved in administering the pension scheme; the scheme's annual reports and accounts; investment management papers and actuarial reports; scheme members' registers; and publicity materials, such as explanatory booklets for members.

There are also records relating to occupational schemes in the Corporation of Trinity House entry in the Charity pensions section of this guide.

CITY OF LONDON POLICE PENSIONS

City of London police benefited from three funds: a Retirement Fund, a Widows' Relief Fund and a Widowers' Relief Fund. The funds were established in 1839 in accordance with Section XIV of City of London Police Act, the act giving statutory approval to the force as an independent body.

Participation in the schemes was compulsory for the Retirement and Widows' Relief Funds and, if the policeman was married or widowed, the third scheme was also compulsory. The Widows' and Widowers' Relief Funds were voluntary after the member retired from the force.

All three schemes were unusual in that they did not require regular contributions to a fund from its members, instead levying a charge on all members when a member retired, died or was widowed. The rate of the contribution was determined by the rank of both the contributing member and the retiring member. This meant that the sum retiring members received depended upon the size of the

force at the time the member retired, which, from the papers, seems to have created difficulties in the administration of the fund.

The Retirement Fund gave members a lump sum payment on retirement or when certified medically unfit. The Widows' Relief Fund provided a sum to a widow, next of kin or other nominee on the death of a member. The Widowers' Relief Fund provided a sum to its members on the death of their wife.

The funds were wound down in 1956: in 1955 there were 1619 members of the Widows' Retirement Fund (953 of whom were retired) and 1386 members of the Widowers' Retirement Fund.

There are records relating to police pensions in both the City of London Police collection (CLA/048) and the City of London Corporation's archive as the Court of Common Council is the governing body of the City of London Police Force and appoints its Commissioner of Police. The Court's Police Committee was responsible for supplying and equipping the force. There is also relevant material in the Middlesex Sessions of the Peace Post 1889 collection (MXS).

CITY PAROCHIAL FOUNDATION (CLC/119)

According to the City Parochial Foundation's historian Victor Belcher, the Foundation's Polytechnic Council established a pension and superannuation fund in 1902. Initially the fund provided endowment assurance policies for the Polytechnics' Principals and a hardship fund for other staff, but in 1905 endowment schemes were established for secretaries and expanded to all staff in 1906. Participants had to match the funding provided by the Foundation. Belcher suggests this fund could be the basis of the Universities Superannuation Scheme. This fund was eventually made obsolete by the provisions of the School Teachers (Superannuation) Act 1918 and the admission of non-teaching staff to the London County Council's Superannuation and Provident Fund in 1929.¹

Information about the Polytechnic Council's pension fund can be found in the published minutes of the City Parochial Foundation's Central Governing Body, which are held in the Guildhall Library, and in the Second Report submitted to the Central Governing Body by the Clerk of the Foundation (1927), also held at Guildhall.²

CLERGY PENSIONS INSTITUTION

The Clergy Pensions Institution was set up in 1886 as a voluntary pension scheme for the clergy. It sold deferred annuities to the clergy, and these funds were supplemented with donations. It operated alongside local Diocese based measures, and had around 4000 members in the late 1890s. The Clergy Pensions Institution was taken over by the Church of England Pension Board which introduced a compulsory pension scheme for the clergy in January 1927.³

Please note that the main records of the Clergy Pensions Institution, which include minutes, accounts and reports for the period 1887-1981, are held at the Church of England Record Office (reference CPI).

Gordon L. Jacob and Company set up a fund for the benefit of its clerks and employees 'where character or length of service may in the judgement of the Trustees entitle them to a claim upon it and to assist them and their dependents'. The firm made an annual contribution of at least £50, which was paid out in single grants or periodical allowances. The fund's trustees could also make grants to employees or former employees in cases of sickness or ill health, and were empowered to make discretionary grants to employees' widows or dependents.⁵

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JEWISH MEMORIAL COUNCIL: SYNAGOGUE PROVIDENT AND PENSIONS FUND (ACC/2999)

The Jewish Memorial Council administered the Synagogue Provident and Pensions Fund, a superannuation fund for all officials in Jewish congregations within the British Commonwealth.

A Superannuation Committee was first established by the Council in 1923 to look at the issue of pensions, and the scheme this Committee proposed was adopted by the Council in 1924 and approved by the Inland Revenue in 1926. The scheme became the Synagogue Provident and Pensions Fund in 1928, when the money raised to establish a separate Provident Fund was

incorporated into the Fund. The funds of this separate Provident Fund were kept separately in a Supplementary Pension Fund, which provided additional assistance to members, widows and orphans in cases of hardship, with the level of assistance determined by a Pensions Administration Committee. The scheme's trustee was the Jewish Memorial Council.⁶

The Chartered Gas Light and Coke Company, based in Bridge Street, Blackfriars, was formally established in 1810 and began producing gas in September 1813 after receiving a charter from the Prince Regent in 1812. After the passing of the Gas Bill in 1948 the Company handed over its assets to the North Thames Gas Board in May 1949.

The company's Superannuation Fund, one of the earliest occupational pension schemes, was established in 1841 for the benefit of superannuated officers of the Company. Officers earning under or over £100 per annum contributed 2½ and 5% of their salaries respectively, and after at least 10 years' service they were entitled to a pension according to their years' service at the age of 65 (or earlier if incapable because of infirmity of mind or body).

Those who had served between 10 and 17 years received a pension of 3/12ths of their annual salary; those who had served 45 years or over were entitled to 8/12ths of their annual salary.

In September 1851 the members of the Fund voted to abolish it, with minutes in the collection showing that the proprietors intended to use the contribution they withdrew from the Fund at its abolition to establish a new fund.

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ROYAL NATIONAL PENSION FUND FOR NURSES

The National Pension Fund for Nurses was founded in 1887 by Henry C. Burdett (1847-1920), and based in Cheapside. Burdett was secretary to the shares and loans department of the Stock Exchange, but had a background in hospital administration. The chief object of the Fund was to provide a retirement income and allowances for nurses who were unable to work through sickness or accident. The Fund was open to 'all responsible paid officials connected with hospitals and kindred institutions'.⁸

The Fund was based upon the contribution of members, the profits made from investments of these contributions, and a Donation Bonus Fund. The Fund attracted a number of benefactors – the first donation of £20,000 (around £1,000,000 in today's money) was received from Junius S. Morgan (head of merchant bank J. S. Morgan and Company, which became Morgan, Grenfell and Company).

ROYAL NAVY

In 1590 the Chatham Chest was established to provide pensions to wounded seamen of the Royal Navy, named for the chest where the assets of the scheme were stored. This was probably the first funded occupational pension fund in the world. Each month 5% was deducted from seamen's wages and paid into the chest. Pensions were payable on a fixed scale according to the degree of injury. The pensions were payable for life but were regularly reviewed and could be reduced or terminated if the pensioner was found to have recovered sufficiently to be capable of employment. The Chest was merged with the Royal Greenwich Hospital in 1803. LMA's material relating to Royal Navy pensions is from the William Lampen collection (O/181).

SCHOOL MISTRESSES AND GOVERNESSES BENEVOLENT INSTITUTION (LMA/4459)

The Governesses Benevolent Institution was founded in London in 1841 to assist governesses during illness, poverty and old age. The Institution established a Provident Fund in 1843 to encourage governesses to purchase annuities that would mature on their retirement. The Institution began investing in Government securities and private enterprise for financing annuities. Annuities were allocated to applicants elected to receive them by the Institution's membership and the first was given in 1844. The Provident Department advised governesses and schoolmistresses on purchasing annuities for their old age but it was replaced in 1937 when members of the Institution's board set up the Governesses Mutual Provident Fund, an independent association for providing pensions to governesses and school mistresses. The company was renamed the 'Women Teachers' Thrift Association' in 1944. The Association's management committee included members of the Institution's Board of Management, two headmistresses of girls' schools and three depositing members. It also operated a staff scheme for members of the Institution and an annuity scheme. The Association came to an end in 1965.

The Jubilee Memorial Fund for Aged and Destitute Governesses, founded in 1887 by Miss M.C. Westall, was amalgamated with the Governesses Benevolent Institution in 1938 and investments were used to fund the Westall Memorial Annuities.

THE PRESS ASSOCIATION (CLC/B/181)

In 1882 The Press Association established an Insurance and Endowment Fund. It was voluntary for present staff members, but new members were required to join the scheme. Each employee insured his or her life for the amount of their present annual salary. An annuity fund for the staff of the Association was first set up in 1897 (the Staff Annuity Fund). In 1921 this fund was closed to new members following the establishment of a supplementary fund, called the 'Annuity Fund (1921)', and a fund for the Association's officers, the 'Officers' Fund'.
